

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OBTAINING A RE-ISSUE OF A REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE.

1. Fill in the enclosed declaration form including the signature of a Commissioner, Notary Public or Justice of the Peace.
2. Draw in the markings on the diagram on the back of the form.
3. Forward Pictures of the horse to the Canadian Belgian Horse Association office, showing the face and each side of the body, if possible.
4. Fees for a duplicate or reissued certificate are required; refer to the current CBHA fee schedule for current rates.
5. The owner submitting the declaration for reissue must be a current member of the Canadian Belgian Horse Association, or it is double the standard fee.
6. The issuing of a duplicate certificate renders the original certificate null and void.

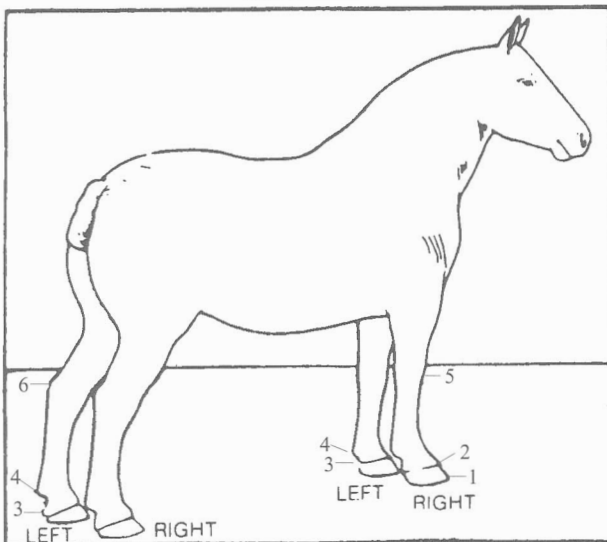

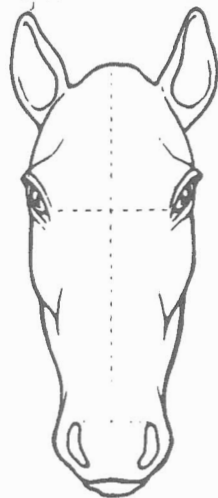
1--Hoof 2--Coronet 3--Heel 4--Fetlock 5--Knee 6--Hock
