- 3. Forward Pictures of the horse to the Canadian Belgian Horse Association office, showing the face and each side of the body, if possible.
- 4. Fees for a duplicate or reissued certificate are required; refer to the current CBHA fee schedule for current rates.
- 5. The owner submitting the declaration for reissue must be a current member of the Canadian Belgian Horse Association, or it is double the standard fee.
- 6. The issuing of a duplicate certificate renders the original certificate null and void.


